ASSOCIATION OF DOMESTIC, HOME-BASED, AND FACTORY WORKERS (ATRAHDOM), GUATEMALA

When ATRAHDOM registered as an organisation representing women workers, they established Guatemala's first domestic workers' union. They also helped create unions for women in maquilas (factories) and for sex workers. ATRAHDOM fights fiercely for labour and human rights - especially for indigenous, migrant, and older women. ATRAHDOM contributed to the negotiation of ILO Convention 189, ensuring domestic workers' rights to occupational safety, social security, minimum wage, maternity protections, health insurance, rest, leave, and pensions.
